



# Course Admission Information Set

## GRIFFITH UNIVERSITY

Griffith University is committed to providing transparent and clear admissions advice to applicants. This guide provides a summary of the OP/selection rank profile for a course (where offers were made wholly or partly on the basis of OP/selection rank) for offers made for Semester 1, 2017 admission as well as the student profile of all students enrolled in a course as at the [census](#) date for Semester 1, 2017.

### COMMON TERMINOLOGY

#### OVERALL POSITION (OP)

An OP is a student's position in a state wide rank order based on their overall achievement in Authority subjects. It indicates how well a student has done in comparison to all other OP-eligible students in Queensland and is used for tertiary entrance purposes only. Students are placed in 1 of 25 OP bands from OP1 (highest) to OP25 (lowest). For more information see the QTAC [website](#).

#### SELECTION RANK

A selection rank is a numerical score between 1 and 99 (99 is the highest), used to compare different qualifications on the same scale for the purpose of tertiary entrance. For more information see the QTAC [website](#).

#### ADJUSTMENT FACTORS

Considerations such as equity or subject 'bonus points' or lowered OP thresholds that may be taken into account to adjust the effective selection rank of an applicant. The availability and parameters of any such adjustments are determined by institutions themselves and may vary from provider to provider.

#### 75<sup>TH</sup> PERCENTILE / THIRD QUARTILE

This represents the OP scores of the highest 25% of offers made from the lowest 75%. This means that about 75% of the offers in the data set lie below this number and about 25% lie above.

#### 25<sup>TH</sup> PERCENTILE / FIRST QUARTILE

This represents the OP scores of the lowest 25% of offers made from the highest 75%. This means that about 25% of the offers in the data set lie below this number and about 75% lie above.

#### OP AND SELECTION RANK PROFILE

These tables provide the OP/selection rank (OP/rank) profile for places offered wholly or partly on the basis of OP/selection rank for semester 1, 2017 admission.

#### STUDENT PROFILE

These tables give an indication of the likely peer cohort for new students at GU. It provides data on students that commenced undergraduate study and passed the census date for semester 1, 2017 including those admitted through all offer rounds and international students studying in Australia.

#### ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

In addition to general admissions criteria (available at the Griffith University [website](#)), this course also has the following additional entry requirement:

- Applicants must meet the criteria for a domestic Australian student and have completed at least two OUA undergraduate units or equivalent with a minimum GPA of 4.0 completed in the last 12 months at the time of application for admission OR have an OP15/Rank 67/ATAR 63.55.
