## Guidelines for Enrolment in Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood Education)

1. Students are strongly encouraged to complete **all** the subjects in each level of the degree before progressing to the subjects of the subsequent level. For example, all level one subjects should be completed prior to enrolling in a level two subject. Students must complete all prerequisite subjects required.

2. Students should ensure they check the *type* of pre-requisite (Mandatory, Conditional, Corequisite) when planning their enrolment. <u>https://www.open.edu.au/faq-and-glossary/glossary</u>

3. Students should ensure they check the availability of subjects when planning their enrolment as subjects are not available in every study period. Subject availability for the current calendar year is listed on each subject's page in the OUA Handbook.

4. Specified Electives must be selected from the list, however students may choose any **two** Electives from the list.

6. **All** core and elective subjects must be completed before students can enrol in their final subject, EDC450 Professional Experience 4: The Internship. Students will need to contact <u>hum-ed-ouaprac@curtin.edu.au</u> to request permission to enrol in EDC450.

7. A full-time study load is two units per study period (which equates to eight units per year). Approval will not be given to enrol into more than two units per study period if prerequisites have not been met.
